Joe also worked on many important projects, including two Casino referendums, and was instrumental in the creation and

development of Kwatokent Television, better known as KTV.

Joe has also been a staple at many local social & sporting events, often acting as the Master of Ceremonies and providing play-by-play commentary for the local figure skating club, lacrosse & hockey games. He was even a color commentator on TSN 690 for the short-lived Montreal Express of the National Lacrosse League.
